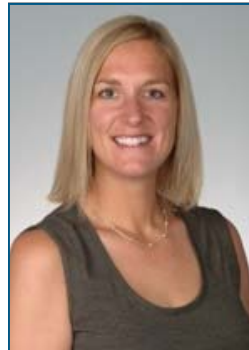




MATCH DAY 2011 A Success!

Thank you to everyone who helped make the 2010-2011 recruitment season another success! We filled all 25 categorical positions with excellent candidates. Five preliminary interns round out the intern class. We also filled two medicine/pediatrics and two medicine/psychiatry spots through the match.

The overall percentage of female residents in the program is 48.5%. Eleven percent of our residents for 2011-2012 are under-represented minorities. 25% of the categorical and 100% of the preliminary interns are MUSC graduates. The other PGY1 residents are geographically diverse, representing 17 different medical schools.

Please join us in welcoming our new interns to the Department of Medicine and Division of Emergency Medicine!



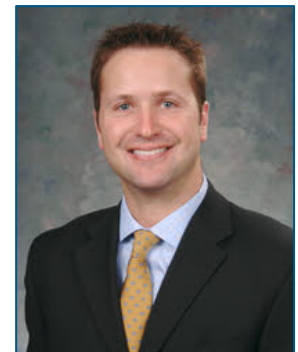

The combined residency program in internal medicine and pediatrics consolidates two excellent programs and provides a unique training experience. The program exposes the resident to every sub-specialty with an emphasis on primary care. This rigorous training program is designed to educate general physicians on the complete range and depth of complex illnesses across the life span.

Upon completion of the program, residents will be eligible for board certification in both internal medicine and pediatrics. Graduates may elect to enter primary care private practice, general academic medicine, or sub-specialty fellowship training in either, or both specialty areas.

The combined residency program requires four years (48 months) of residency training, divided equally between internal medicine and pediatrics. The resident serves at a postgraduate training Level 1 for 12 months (6 months on each specialty).

Throughout the four years of training the resident rotates between services, alternating three month blocks on each service. While on each rotation and throughout the entire training period the resident serves as a categorical resident for each program and attends all educational conferences for each rotation.

Continuity clinic experience continues throughout each rotation with alternating weeks in the internal

medicine and pediatric continuity clinics.

In addition to educational conferences available in each program, residents in the combined program participate in specific internal medicine/pediatrics monthly conferences.

This year we received 148 applications, interviewed 27 applicants and matched two excellent candidates for our program, please join me in welcoming them to MUSC and the Departments of Medicine and Pediatrics!

The Department of Psychiatry & Behavioral Sciences and the Department of Medicine offer an integrated training program that prepares residents for specialty board eligibility in both Psychiatry and Medicine. The program meets all objectives and guidelines for combined training leading to dual certification established by the American Board of Internal Medicine and the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology (November 1996), and includes the components of our independent Internal Medicine and Psychiatry programs which are fully accredited by their respective Residency Review Committees.

The program provides residents with instruction and experience in the prevention, detection and treatment of acute and chronic medical and psychiatric illness presenting in both inpatient and ambulatory settings. The faculty are responsible for resident supervision during clinical rotations sponsored by their respective departments. The level of hospital and faculty commitment to the combined program is excellent. Residents attend joint educational conferences involving primary care residents from internal medicine and psychiatry as well as the didactic offerings of the independent programs.

This year we received 148 applications, interviewed 15 candidates and matched two excellent candidates for our program, please join us in welcoming them to MUSC and the Departments of Medicine and Psychiatry!
